## **FAQ - Hammonton Community Garden:**

## WHERE IS THE GARDEN?

The garden is located at 11<sup>th</sup> and Washington, behind the NJ Transit Train Station.



## **HOW MUCH DOES IT COST TO PARTICIPATE?**

\$20 is all that it costs for a garden plot for the season (April 22 through the end of October)

**HOW BIG ARE THE GARDEN PLOTS?** Plots are 12' long by 4' wide

WHAT IS PROVIDED? Raised beds from untreated wood have been filled with rich natural compost to provide a great growing medium. Water is available onsite. A storage shed holds some basic tools including wheelbarrows, shovels and watering cans. We are further developing our common area which has tables, benches and other seating. Additional amenities will be added as the garden develops.

**WHO CAN PARTICIPATE?** The garden is open to everyone who agrees to the guidelines, completes an application and submits the \$20 fee.

**IS IT AN ORGANIC GARDEN?** Yes – we will be gardening without the use of synthetic pesticides or herbicide. Guidance is available!

## I WOULD LIKE TO PARTICIPATE, BUT I DON'T KNOW A LOT ABOUT GARDENING.

**IS THAT OK?** Absolutely! Our gardeners are very willing to share information and provide guidance. Experienced gardeners can serve as mentors to new gardens. We also plan "garden talks" during the growing season. These free presentations are open to the public and are a great way to learn more and can connect with more experienced gardeners.
